

# **D-I-Y Puffy Paint**

Create your own puffy paint at home!

#### Big Idea

Students will mix together their own paint and watch it puff up before their very eyes!

#### Materials

- 1 Cup Flour
- $1^{1/2}$  tsp Baking Powder or Baking Soda
- Paper/cardboard/cardstock
- Large bowl
- Large mixing spoon

- Q-tip/brush
- Food Coloring/ Tempera Paint
- Water
- 3 small bowls for different colors
- ¼ tsp Salt

## Setup

At a table lined with newspaper, set out the flour, baking powder, and salt. In front of every child, set a piece of paper. Have the children write their names on the back of the paper before they begin painting and the paper becomes oversaturated.

## Directions

- 1. To start this project, get flour, baking powder, salt mix together in small bowl. Add a bit of water and stir until you get a smooth, thin paste (about the same consistency of stirred yogurt).
- 2. Next, separate into different bowls that will become different colors. Then add a little bit of food coloring or tempera paint and mix well.
- 3. Use Q-tips or brushes to apply the mixture on to the piece of paper, cardstock, or small piece of cardboard.
- 4. With adult assistance, put painting into microwave for 30 seconds and watch it puff up!



# 5. Allow picture to cool before handling.

Investigation Questions:

- What do you notice?
- How does it feel before it goes in microwave and after?
- What changes do you see happening to your paper?
- What do you think would happen if you mixed more than one color together?
